If you see anyone acting outside of the rules and/or causing unusual damage call a cease fire and contact a board member with as much information as you can. With our new security system we can identify who is at the club at any particular time. We have zero tolerance for safety violations.

## **Work Party:**

The annual Spring work party will be held on **Sat. April 28th**. We will start at 8:00 and plan to finish by 1:00. Coffee and doughnuts will be provided throughout the morning, pizza for lunch and each participant will be eligible for a \$500 raffle ticket drawn in September.

All new members who are required to attend two work parties are strongly encouraged to attend.

Planned projects are as follows and if you wish to participate in or have special tool for a particular project please call the project leader to volunteer and bring the appropriate tools and clothes.

### **A. New metal target frames** – Bob McCarty 508-230-8482

Bob will need welders, people to assemble metal parts and people to set them on the ranges.

### **B. New large wooden target frames** – Steve Buck 305-849-2493

Steve will need people to build 9 more 4' x 4' target frames out of 2" x 4"s and people to paint a 3" yellow border on 40 - 4'x4' panels. Compound miter saws, nail guns and spray painting equipment would make this go quicker, if you have any of this please let me know.

### **C. Pot Holes** – Joe Hurley 508-230-4174

Joe will need people to do the final grading after he places the new fill in the pot holes around the club. Bring your steel rakes.

### **D. Range Clean-up** – Jim Pendergast 781-710-7696

Jim will need people to pick up the rocks and target debris to get ready for the Spring mowing. Bring steel rakes and gloves.

## **PROJECTS:**

### **Target Frames:**

We are experimenting with new target frames at both the 100 and 300 yard ranges with the hope that they will last longer, make less mess and reduce the total cost. The ones at the 100 yard range will be metal and will accept 24" X 24" cardboard or thin plywood. We will try to keep a supply of available but feel free to bring your own sheets. We have also added various steel plate targets at the 100 and 300 yard ranges. Your comments are welcomed.

The frames at the 300 yard range are more substantial than the old frames, larger and we hope that people using this range will not shoot the frame material. The target board material is marked with a yellow no shoot zone in front of the supports. **Be aware of your backstop when shooting at the 200 yard targets make sure that you are not lined up with the ones at 300 yards.**

### **Heating System:**

We are progressing with our efforts to upgrade the heating system. We need one more quote and **we are looking for a member who has knowledge of heating systems who can help us evaluate the quotes. Please contact a board member if you can help.**

## **Security Gate:**

Gate Operation:

A. The gate will open by passing your card within 12 inches of the card reader and will close when you have passed through with your vehicle. **DO NOT TAILGATE with the car in front of you..**

B. The card will also open the club house door and the inside range.

C. The gate will make the club much safer as it will record who is at the club and their arrival and departure time.

## **Range Officer:**

We have found it necessary to post a part time range officer who will be reviewing the range rules with new folks and some who may choose to ignore them. The primary issue is the trash that some people leave at the ranges. We have found target frames completely destroyed and left out on the range, cans, bottles, fruits and vegetables used as targets and left and the continuing issue of brass, steel and shot gun shells not cleaned up.

A word to the wise – If you want to continue to use the range please review the range rules before you shoot and pick up after yourself.

**Please respect and heed the advice of the range officer, we are just trying to run a clean, friendly and respectful club without implementing any unnecessary extra rules.**

## **SAFETY:**

This is our club. Those of us who have been to or were members of other clubs know what an incredible gem we have here. Unfortunately, we live in a part of the country where most people do not understand our sport and would just as soon not have us here. We have the privilege to practice our sport safely in this country and the only thing that can stop us is US if WE are unsafe. That is why we are constantly stressing the importance of safety...for our club and our members, as well as guests and our neighbors. We take our rules very seriously, and we take all safety violations seriously as well. **Every one of us is responsible for the safety rules and the cleanliness of our club.** If you notice anyone behaving in an unsafe manner, call a cease fire, and explain to them what they're doing that is unsafe. Be polite about it, not confrontational. Get their name, if you can. Get their license plate number, and note the date and time of the offense. Then call a Board member ASAP. We have a ZERO TOLERANCE policy for safety violations. Violations can result in temporary suspension of membership privileges or permanent loss of membership privileges. We may also notify your license issuing authority, depending on the infraction.

BE FRENDLY, COURTIIOUS, SAFE -- SHOOT OFTEN AND BRING A FRIEND.

### **Range procedure during power outages:**

1. Do not go down range without personally calling a cease fire on all the outdoor ranges.
2. If you are the only one at the club, park your car in front of the 300 yard range with the lights flashing and your alarm siren on if you have one before going down range.
3. Do not use the inside range
